4. What is an undesirable substance? In explaining your answer, provide four examples of substances for which maximum legal levels have been established.

5. What is Earned Recognition and to which feed business operators does it apply?

(10 marks)

6. Explain the terms 'documentary check', 'identity check' and 'physical check' in relation to imported feed.

(10 marks)

7. Your manager has asked you to produce a work instruction for feed officers for formal sampling of bagged compound livestock feed at mills and merchants within your local authority. Write a work instruction for formal sampling of animal feed in accordance with Retained EU Legislation 152/2009, giving reasons for the steps and required equipment through to submission to the agriculture analyst.

8. Discuss the effectiveness of the provisions for traceability and product withdrawal and recall under Retained Regulation EC 178/2002 to ensure unsafe feed is removed from the market.

### 9. Answer both parts:

(a) Explain the provisions for the use and serving of a feed improvement notice and the information required in such a notice.

(15 marks)

(b) Discuss the effectiveness of feed improvement notices to ensure legal compliance with feed labelling.

### 10. Answer both parts:

(a) Compare and contrast the provisions for feed business operators and competent authorities under specified feed law for the registration and approval of feed businesses.

(22 Marks)

(b) Describe 4 activities requiring approval and 4 activities requiring registration, with their respective codes.
