Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) sees home buyer receive full reservation fee refund

A Home Buyer from Shropshire has received a full refund of her £1,000 reservation fee following a successful claim via the Consumer Code's Independent Dispute Resolution Scheme.

The Home Buyer raised the complaint after the Home Builder refused to refund the reservation fee. The Home Buyer also felt that the Home Builder did not provide enough pre- purchase information for her to make an informed purchasing decision or provide appropriate information about warranties and health and safety.

Based on the evidence available, the adjudicator concluded that a breach of the Code had occurred in relation to the Home Buyer's reservation agreement. As a result, the Home Buyer has received a full reservation fee refund of $\pounds1,000$.

The Code's Independent Dispute Resolution Scheme is free for consumers and provides an alternative route to solving disputes, using experienced, impartial adjudicators. Decisions are usually completed within 12 weeks of the claim being received.
