His role with the BHTA involved him in a broad spectrum of activities and advising groups at government level. Some of this work has culminated in the BHTA achieving an Office of Fair Trading approved Code of Practice, and Ray was also the former Chair of the Code Sponsors Panel for the Consumer Codes Approval Scheme. In 2010, Ray was awarded the MBE for services to the Healthcare Industry.
