Why should I set up a regional group?

Although we have a responsibility to reflect and protect our local communities, our profession is failing to do this.

This is where you come in – by setting a regional group we are able to implement change from the ground up.

Starting up your own group in five simple steps

Step 1: Take the leap! It may seem daunting at first but if this is something you are passionate about DO IT!

Step 2: Get into contact with the CTSI Race and Equalities Working Group to express your interest in starting a group.

Step 3: Find like-minded individuals in the same region as you. You'll need to connect people who have a similar vision and are willing to commit to it.

Step 4: Set up your group's governance i.e. terms of reference, aims, roles, meetings and BUDGET. This step should be completed in collaboration with the national group. Check the CTSI website for more details: www.tradingstandards.uk/news-policy/race-and-equalities

- Chair
- Vice chair
- Secretary
- Treasurer
- Member responsible for networking with local businesses
- Member responsible for liaising with members and local councils within their region
- Member responsible for diversity events and social media
