



What impact do you feel will be caused on food additives by the transfer to WTO rules?

It wont have a huge impact initially. It will be a case of looking at what the particular food is, what the additive is and what the levels are, and then looking at the Codex Alimentarius.

Can you confirm what name and address needs to be on food products produced and packaged in England from 1 January 2021 for sale in NI and for sale in the EU?

Essentially, because Northern Ireland is regarded as being part of the EU the name and address will need to be a food business located in Northern Ireland or the EU.

The Food Information Regulations in the EU Regulation 1169 (2011) states that the food business is responsible for the food information. Can you confirm what the situation is with organic products produced and packed in England from 1 January 2021 for sale in NI and EU?



The important thing to note is whether the presence of the address is capable of taking responsibility of the business.

Will protection for the current EU PGI, PDO TSG products will still apply in England from 1 January 2021, and if so where the provision to preserve the requirements or The Quality Schemes (Agricultural Products and Foodstuffs) Regulations 2018 can be found?

The origin indications that Great Britain registered with previously will still continue to be recognised within GB.

Refer to the <u>Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs</u> (Defra) guidance.



On 07/12/20 the EU agreed with the UK Organic Control Bodies that the EU will allow products from GB into the EU for 12 months with the existing logos.

This means that the EU will recognise the bodies certification methodology for the next 12 months.



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
