With the challenges of changing markets and technology, it is essential that local authority practitioners are equipped with the knowledge and skills to work effectively with business to build consumer confidence and leading approaches to compliance.

A programme has been developed to deliver FREE product safety and legal metrology training to all local authorities throughout the UK.

The programme consists of a seminar and a number of workshops that will take place during the period of April 2020 – March 2021. Places are FREE to all local authorities.

The following specific competencies will be developed & delivered:



Legal Metrology and Product Safety Seminar

The focus of this year's OPSS Legal Metrology and Product Safety Seminar is on preparations that OPSS and BEIS colleagues are taking to prepare for the end of transition period and the implications this has for product safety and legal metrology regulation across the UK.

Participants will gain an oversight of the work that is ongoing to ensure that the UK has a robust system of regulation that protects consumers and enables businesses to thrive. The webinar will include changes to conformity assessment and CE marking, including the move to UKCA mark, using practical scenarios enabling participants to consider how the changes affect different products and businesses in both Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

Product Safety Training Programme

Distribution, Fulfilment Houses and On-line investigations

This is an online course aimed at reviewing and refreshing participants' knowledge around legislation impacting on the role played by fulfilment houses in the distribution chain.

It is intended to build on practitioners' existing knowledge around product safety legislation, particularly on the use and application of the General Product Safety Regulations. The course will review legal principles as well as share practical examples. It will explore definitions & the different roles within the supply chain, update participants on potential changes, highlight other agencies with interests in this area, and share practical considerations and solutions when dealing with a fulfilment house.

Objectives

To build confidence when undertaking an inspection at a fulfilment house to determine the role played by a fulfilment house and therefore the responsibilities owned by the business.

To ensure advice provided to non-compliant companies is effective.

To understand the roles other agencies can play in disrupting activity.

To provide enforcement authorities with the knowledge and skills (including the use of notices) to prevent dangerous goods being made available to consumers.

This workshop will also introduce and make local authorities aware of online markets and assist them in setting up online product safety investigations.

Software in Measuring Instruments

The significance of software in weighing and measuring equipment has become paramount in their operation and must be seen in the same way as we would regard indicators on a weighbridge or the meter in a liquid fuel measuring instrument.

The course objectives include:

- an introduction to some of the terms that we need to understand when undertaking market surveillance and inspections on weighing and measuring instruments using software;
- practical examples on how inspectors can manage software inspections; and examination of the international guidance on this subject.

This workshop will look at the wide range of controlled automatic weighing instruments that Inspectors of Weights and Measures may be expected to verify and inspect. It will look in some detail at the verification of catch-weighers under OIML R51 and will consider the controls necessary for check-weighers for the purpose of Directive 76/211. There will some discussion on the legislation covering automatic and non-automatic totalising instruments, automatic gravimetric weighing instruments and automatic rail weighbridges.
